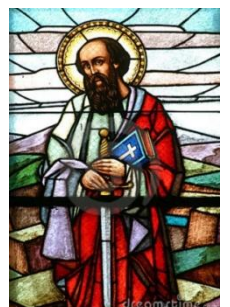
Stage 3 mass is on Friday. The students and teachers from Years 5 and 6 have prepared a liturgy and you are most welcome to join us for mass at 9.10am.

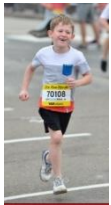
Prayer:

3. Minutes of Previous Meeting

The minutes of the previous general meeting (10th June 2014) were accepted by Sean McIntosh and Alyssa Dwyer.

4. Matters arising from previous minutes

Danielle Bliss advised she has not heard anything further about the representative jerseys. She will follow up with Fiona Lambert.

Tim Ellis asked about the review of the Uniform Shop. Danielle advised that the committee is still working through this issue and there is nothing to report at this stage.

5. Correspondence in

Vanessa Cassin provided a list of correspondence received.

6..Treasurers Report

Tim Hamilton provided the Treasurer's Report. The current amount of funds available is \$42234.16. There is \$46316.38 on hand but a number of cheques are yet to be presented. The Term Deposit has been rolled over for a further 3 months.

7. Parish Priest Report

There was no Parish Priests report.

8. Principals Report

Marian Bell presented the Principal's Report.

Term 3:

- ✓ Day 1 of this term was a staff development day – we went to Mary MacKillop Place for our spirituality day. An excellent day – great way to start the term.
- ✓ Other professional learning for this term – all staff are up to date with our anaphylaxis training, there is a new student information system called FACES that is being rolled out this term – it requires a considerable amount of training by 4 key members on staff – Jane Misek, Leanda Standing, Rita Nobili and Juanita Gray. They will then return and teach the rest of us. The roll out is for 3 weeks in September and we will be well supported by the office. I will be attending the Principal's Master class in August. There were 5 teachers who attended a maths course last week that reported that it was a very worthwhile day that has already had an impact on their teaching. DIN – diversity is the norm course for Gemma N and Vicki M
- ✓ Quite a few excursions this term – Yr 1 to the farm, Yr 2 to the aquarium, Yr 6 to Minnamurra Falls, Yr 5 camp, Kindy incursion from CSIRO – mini beasts; Rip and Surf education talk for Yrs 5 & 6.
- ✓ RE program – Grandparents Day – mass, open classrooms and morning tea; Mary MacKillop feast day mass – August 1; Feast of the Assumption – August 8; Stage 3 mass – August 22; Parish mass – August 31; year 4 and year 6 children will complete a Religious Literacy Assessment – diocesan wide; First reconciliation – Thursday August 28; Father's Day breakfast, mass and stall; Catholic Mission talks for whole school and the Vinnies door knock appeal o Saturday August 23.

- ✓ EXPO news – rehearsal is well under way and the item is looking great. The tickets have been printed and will go on sale next week. There are only 2 per family. EXPO date is Wednesday August 27. There has already been a lot of work behind the scenes with some very generous parents and teachers helping out. I am thinking that we really need to acknowledge everyone's contribution – wondering about how??
- ✓ EXPO working bee last Sunday was a wonderful event – thanks to all of the families who came and offered their time and talents
- ✓ Sport this term is conducted by Sport in Schools Australia every Monday. Chn seem to be enjoying it. They are also participating in their weekly sport lesson with Angela Dunn. Netball gala day last Tuesday – we sent 7 teams and I believe it was a great day. Zone athletics carnival is on Thursday August 14.
- ✓ Tree assessment has been conducted and there is a summary for any who are interested. We need to urgently cut down 5 trees with several others needing attention. Three companies have been asked to give quotes – the first will be on Monday.

There was a favourable discussion about the improvements in the car park.

Nikki Cummins raised the idea of a vegetable patch and the possibility of getting some grandparents involved with the project. Marian thinks there might be a suitable spot where one of the large trees are going to be removed and is very excited about the idea. There was a general discussion about this and those present thought it would be great for the children. There was a brief discussion about the number of government grants available to schools. It was suggested that it would be great if a parent would be willing to take on researching and writing applications for these.

Vanessa Cassin asked Marian what the results of her investigations into changing the stage were. Marian advised she is now considering the purchase of a portable stage. Mal Green enquired whether we still had the portable stairs that used to be attached to the stage for fetes. No one knew for sure where these were or how big they were. Marian is aware a lot of parents would like the Christmas concert returned to the school and hopes this might be possible with a portable stage.

Jane Misek would like there to be a discussion about technology in the school at some point. Initially the wi-fi needs updating. This will cost at least \$27000. There is also a problem with aging and unreliable laptops in the classrooms. It was suggested that funds raised at the Trivia Night could go towards purchasing technology. Marian and Jane are going to put together a wishlist.
