research project with Monash University specifically looking at the teaching of fractions and Mrs Paul is attending a targeted teaching program to assist primary children with their reading skills. You may also have noticed the high number of teachers who have been away due to illness. While we endeavour to put the same casuals on each class, it is not always possible. So I really appreciate your support in keeping sick children at home.

I am very aware of the discussions about the new **school uniform**. Based on conversations at the uniform meeting last year, Mrs Misk, Mrs Standing and myself went to the factory early last term to discuss the colours and design. Currently, the company is putting together a storyboard of some designs and very soon the uniform committee will make a decision. I have said many times that there is no expectation that children in years 4, 5 and 6 will need to purchase a new uniform if their existing uniforms will last their time at St Paul's. There will be a changeover period of 2 years. The kindergarten children for 2016 will begin in the new uniform from day 1. I have also become aware of a group of parents offering to swap or give uniforms to cover the short fall and I welcome this initiative. There is some stock still available of the current uniform in the uniform shop. If you have any further questions, please contact me for clarification.

Finally, I welcome Karen Love to the Leadership Team. In Gemma Natoli's absence, Karen has been appointed as Acting Coordinator 2 for the next 5 weeks and will be specifically looking at data to inform our teaching. Congratulations Karen and welcome aboard!

The results of the referendum were 90 per cent of Australians agreeing to make amendments to our Constitution. This was the start of the reconciliation movement. The outcomes of this momentous decision were far reaching with the establishment of citizenship and voting rights for all indigenous people. Since then the fight for recognition and awareness of the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders has continued to be forged.

In 1996 Australia celebrated National Reconciliation Week for the first time. It gives people the opportunity to focus on reconciliation between indigenous and non-indigenous Australians. Many see it as a time to reflect on the achievements so far and what still needs to be achieved through Reconciliation. National Reconciliation Week falls between 27 May and 3 June every year. These dates mark two important historical events for indigenous Australians; the anniversary of the referendum and Mabo Day.

In recognition of our Indigenous Australians, our Mini Vinnies team are organising classroom visits where they will hold prayer services and short input sessions highlighting the insights of Indigenous Australians. We could learn a lot from Aboriginal Spirituality. The Dreaming is a complex network of knowledge, faith and practises that derive from stories of Creation and it dominates all spiritual and physical aspects of Aboriginal life. It sets our structure of society, rules for social behaviour and ceremonies performed in order to maintain the life of the land. The Dreaming governs the way people live and how they should behave. The Dreaming tells the journeys of the Spirit Ancestors who made the world and whose Spirit inhabits the features of the natural world today. It influences every aspect of their life.

In the lead up to National Reconciliation Week maybe we can spend some time with our families reflecting on the important messages that lie within the network of the Dreaming. It would also be a great opportunity to recall our own story of creation and acknowledge God's expectations for us as caretakers of the earth.

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## Canteen

At St Pauls we are fortunate to have a school **tuckshop** that is able to provide healthy foods that help to maximise children's learning ability. Consuming healthy food and drinks not only improves students overall health, but can also improve learning behaviour. However, as parents and teachers we still need to guide children in making wise choices around what they are purchasing from the tuckshop.

We have noticed that many children are ordering ice blocks and treats through the lunch ordering system. Could we please ask that children only order their lunch - ie a sandwich and a drink in the lunch bags and then after they have eaten they can go to the canteen to buy whatever else they need. Many children are not getting through the food they are ordering in the lunch orders or are not eating their sandwich as they have to go and line up to collect the other items they have ordered. (An iceblock cannot be sent to the classroom in a lunch bag).

Older children are at times not putting in lunch orders and are instead lining up with money to buy lunch. The extra items that are available to children to buy during the breaks, while still falling within the guidelines allowed for canteens in NSW schools, are not an alternative to a proper lunch. Please ensure that if your child needs to buy lunch that they do it through a lunch order.

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## Parent Helpers

*Research has demonstrated that parent involvement in the educational process impacts positively on the attitude and conduct of children in school.*

Thank you very much to all the parents that make themselves so readily available to support the learning in our classrooms. I am always amazed at how dedicated the parents at St Pauls are in coming up to the school throughout the day to support both the students and the teachers. As I walk through the school I see parents, particularly in the infants classes, helping out in many different ways but much of this support centres around our literacy groups. We cannot stress how essential it is that children are given the opportunity to practise their reading skills and it is wonderful that we have so many parent helpers to support the students as they practise and consolidate what they have been learning. Children need many different opportunities to read and need to practise their reading skills in front of a range of audiences. Activities such as Readers Theatre, reading to and with children in a variety of contexts and for a range of purposes and talking about reading are all designed to help children engage with a text and develop phrasing and fluency.

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## Library News - Sydney Writers Festival

On Monday 18 May, 60 children from years 3 – 6 represented our school at the Sydney Writer's Festival. The beautifully behaved and engaged children were entertained by four wonderful authors including Andy Griffiths, Jacqueline Harvey, Leigh Hobbs and Anthony Horowitz.

Andy Griffiths did not disappoint. He had the audience in rapturous laughter as he discussed the antics that go on in his famous "tree house" stories. Some of his writing advice to the children included - collide possibilities, take things too far, do the opposite to what the reader expects, make stories funny, adventurous, scary and fun. Ask yourself – What is the worst or the funniest thing that could happen next?

Jacqueline Harvey made the audience well acquainted with her two famous characters, Alice Miranda and Clementine Rose. The readers of Alice Miranda get to travel around the world to places like Japan, New York and Paris. They get to learn how much fun boarding school can be. The readers of Clementine Rose get to experience living in a big old hotel/mansion with a pet pig.

Leigh Hobbs had the audience drawing his characters Old Tom and Mr Chicken. He inspired the children to create wonderful characters by changing ordinary objects into interesting characters by giving them human characteristics.

Anthony Horowitz the man famous for his murder mysteries introduced the audience to his James Bond style character, Andy Rider a 14 year old spy. He also introduced us to the Diamond Brothers, both detectives. His advice to the audience was to try and be happy when you are writing and to enjoy what you are writing because this transpires to the reader.

The children I am sure took great inspiration from the guest speakers and have learnt something about being great authors, readers and illustrators. An entertaining and worthwhile day was had by all.

## Cystic Fibrosis Fundraiser - 65 Roses Month

Dear Parents

I am the parent of a child with Cystic Fibrosis (CF). Reading and writing these words no longer shocks me, but my heart breaks. A baby is born with CF every FOUR days. The average life expectancy of someone who has CF is a measly, miserable 38 years. CF is a complex, degenerative illness which is inherited from a gene from both parents. CF primarily affects the lungs and the digestive system, but eventually affects all major organs in the body.

Like any parents we love and cherish our children and we want a healthy, happy future for all of them, but CF is not curable. It does not rest. CF goes to pre-school with him, it goes shopping with him, it goes to family gatherings with him and it goes on holidays with all of us. Every day we do physiotherapy with him, every day he breathes in hypertonic saline on his nebuliser all in an effort to keep his lungs as clear as possible. We keep him active, we encourage and enforce healthy eating habits, we try and keep him away as much as possible from illness, coughs, colds, flu, infections, all because a simple cold or flu for most non-CF people can mean feeling yuck and a few days in bed, but for CF sufferers it can mean lung damage, hospitalisation, month long courses of antibiotics an IV line...CF goes everywhere with us and every day we fight.
