From the Leaders of Learning

Money! Money! Money! In our current Australian culture, we hear the terms 'Tap and Go' and 'Afterpay'. Of course, as adults we can make meaning of this, but I wonder what our children think of these terms? To some extent, we have become an increasingly 'cashless' society. I wonder if you tipped out your wallet, would you find any cash, or like me, a multitude of plastic cards? What opportunities then, do our children have to play and practice with coins? What incidental learning experiences are we inadvertently denying our children through the convenience of 'tap and go'?

The concept of money and its value can take a while for children to master. In our younger years, children spend time identifying the value of Australian coins, and recognising that 100 cents makes a dollar. Later, children work to perform simple calculations with money, including finding change and rounding money to the nearest five cents.

These holidays, perhaps while you are at the corner shop, or buying ice creams for a treat, I encourage you to use cash. Encourage your children to find the correct coins and notes, and even work out change. Yes, it may take longer and people behind you may have to wait, but it will give your child/ren a context to solve money problems and recognise its value in real world situations.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support this year. While it certainly had its challenges, we have witnessed much learning and growth, thanks to our dedicated staff, eager students and supportive parents. May the peace of the newborn Jesus reign in your hearts and homes this Christmas.

Gift Your Children the Joy of Reading

Of all the things that you give your children, one of the greatest of all is the gift of a love of reading. I write this not as a teacher, but as a granddaughter who had the blessing of a wonderful grandmother who showed me that books could be loved and when you love books magic happens. There is something beautiful in a child who cannot wait to go to bed so that they can open a book and read in the lamplight.



Reading opens doors for a child more than most other things. It broadens their knowledge and gives them time of pleasure, adventures, joys, fears and laughs.

In this modern time, the book has been replaced by the ipad, smartphone and television screen. Over these Summer holidays I encourage you to read a book with your child, to browse through the shelves in a bookshop or visit the local library. Research tells us that reading aloud to children no matter what their age is the magic bullet for creating lifelong readers.

A final note

It's hard to believe that I have only been a part of the St Paul's community for one year. I'm deeply grateful for the trust you have invested in me to support your children and for all the stories you have shared about your most challenging experiences. I'm also thankful for the sense of humour you've brought to my days at work, there's nothing quite like a belly laugh amid chaos.

My last words of advice echo the message I shared during the first 'Parenting in a Pandemic' seminar. Raising children is tough. Raising children and working is tough. Raising children and working and running a household is tough. This is without the common crises of financial difficulty, family conflict and illness.

It is my view that practicing vulnerability and engaging in community are infallible ways of making life's difficulties easier to manage. Being brave and willing to share your story with trusted members of your community reduces feelings of shame and failure. It will remind you that despite your most challenging circumstance, you are not alone and there may well be someone beside you who has shared the same plight.

My goal at every school is to work myself out of a job. When I am asked to move on, I always hope that I am leaving students with a greater sense of resilience than what was present when we first met. My time at St Paul's was cut short, but I hope you, as parents, can carry on the work I started before the new counsellor begins in 2022. Show your children what bravery looks like, they will flourish when they believe in themselves.

Class Promotion Day

Today the children had an opportunity to meet their teachers for 2022. The staff have spent an extraordinary amount of time looking at each individual student, their needs in terms of opportunities for learning and support. Serious consideration has been given to any parent requests and every effort has been made by the teachers to place your child with at least one of their friends and with a teacher or teachers who will support their academic and personal growth. I encourage you to be positive with your child when they come home to discuss their teacher and class for 2022. Moving a child at this late stage is near impossible as such moves affect many children who may have been separated for various reasons in order to create a dynamic and supportive learning environment.

New class names in 2022

We have been advised that our new timetabling system requires consistency when naming roll classes. Often teachers go on leave during the year and this causes issues within the system for roll marking. In 2022 our class names will be Aylward and MacKillop, therefore each grade will be known as A or M and therefore the class name will no longer reflect the name of the teacher allocated to the class, e.g. 1A or 1M, 2A or 2M etc.
